<p>Course Description:</p> <p>In this course, students will gain an understanding of what it means to be an allied health care professional. Topics will include but are not limited to governing bodies and professional associations, clinical communication skills, practice management and ethics in health care and business. Through problem-based learning, the students will work together to gain an understanding of the interprofessional collaborative approach to patient care. Students are exposed to current issues in the Canadian health care system and gain critical thinking and practical skills to become effective health care clinicians.
