<p><b>Course Description:</b></p> <p>This course focuses on Black communities, including health inequities, the impact of structural racism, and resilience. The fundamental goal of the course is to demonstrate that health is not merely a medical or biological phenomenon but more importantly the product of social, economic, political, and environmental factors. To meet this goal the course is designed to examine the intersection of race/ethnicity and health from multiple analytic approaches and methodologies.
