The School of Kinesiology and Health Studies at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a course in Program Planning and Evaluation (HLTH 416*). This is an on-campus, capstone course with an expected enrolment of approximately 110 students. Candidates should have a M.A. or M.Sc. or Ph.D, and teaching experience at the University level in health promotion or a related discipline. This is a fall term appointment for the period September 1 to December 31, 2023, with classes in session from September 6 to December 5, 2023 (followed by the final assessment period).

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant's accessibility needs. Applications should include a complete and current curriculum vitae, letters of reference from two (2) referees, and any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a letter of intent, teaching dossier, etc.
